REPORTING REQUIREMENTS (California)

Report serious injuries, illnesses, or death to Cal/OSHA within 24 hours (Cal/OSHA Title 8 Section 5110). Serious injury: hospitalization >24 hours, amputation, loss of eye, or serious permanent disfigurement.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Medical Emergency

Call 911. Provide first aid if trained. Do not move seriously injured persons unless in immediate danger. Designate someone to meet ambulance and direct to scene.

Fire

Sound alarm. Evacuate all workers. Call 911. Use fire extinguisher ONLY if trained and fire is small. Account for all personnel at assembly point.

Severe Weather

Cease crane operations and work at heights. Seek substantial shelter. Monitor weather alerts. Lightning: 30/30 rule (seek shelter if flash-to-bang < 30 sec, stay 30 min after last strike).

Active Threat / Violence

Run if safe to do so. Hide if you cannot run. Fight only as a last resort. Call 911 when safe. Do not return until cleared by law enforcement.

EVACUATION PROCEDURES

- Assembly point established and communicated to all workers during site orientation
- Site supervisor conducts headcount immediately after evacuation
- No one re-enters the site until cleared by emergency services
- Workers with disabilities or limited mobility: pre-assigned buddy for evacuation assistance
- Evacuation routes posted at jobsite trailer and each floor/level
